


PROPOSED CHANGES TO ABORTION LAW

Two significant back-bench amendments have been tabled to the Governments' Criminal Justice Bill concerning abortion law, one is positive and one is negative. The Bill is approaching Report stage in the Commons so it will soon be decision time for MPs. **Please support a reduction in the time limit to reflect viability** The first (tabled by Caroline Ansell - NC15) concerns the current legal time limit for most (but not all) abortions. This is currently 24 weeks but with appropriate medical care babies can now survive as early as 22 weeks. So the proposal is to reduce the time limit to 22 weeks. Although this limit is still much higher than in most other countries any reduction should be welcomed and supported. Please oppose the legalisation of self-abortion at any stage, for any reason

The second (table by Diana Johnson - NC1) proposes that it should be legal for a woman to self-abort for any reason at any stage in her pregnancy. Apart from the clear negative implications for babies, this is also of concern for the welfare of the mother. It endangers her both physically and psychologically and leaves her even more vulnerable to coercion and abuse.

Catholic Book Club

Church Hall, 18th March 7:30 pm

The Lenten Book Club will conclude with a short workshop in the Parish Hall on Monday 18th March at 7:30 pm.

The book, *Questioning God* (Timothy Radcliffe & Lukasz Popko, Bloomsbury Press, 2023) takes readers through a series of conversations built around 18 biblical questions.

All are welcome to participate.

The subjects of the book's conversations take readers through many topics: absences in the Book of Genesis; questions about the name of God in Genesis and Exodus; Four self-doubting prophets (Moses, Elijah, Jonah and Jermiah); Jesus' challenges to his disciples and responses to questions by the Sadducees and Pontius Pilate; Our Lady's questions at the Annunciation and the Finding in the Temple; Jesus meeting Cleopas and Simon on the road to Emmaus after His Resurrection; the joyful meeting with the disciples over breakfast on the shores of Lake Gallilee; and finally St Paul's challenge to early church leaders to be consistent and to practice what they were preaching.


Midway through the book is a chapter on the Song of Songs which makes us reflect on what beauty is. Thus, the conversations cover topics in the Bible from the very first pages of Genesis to the letters of St Paul. The conversations are generally light, not exceedingly complex, but it is always rewarding to have fellow readers to share perspectives with. In this, our final workshop, we will welcome everyone: readers and non-readers. The format will be a short presentation, a final discussion around the main themes of the book and the sharing of insights from fellow parishioners.


