

One World Week 2021 $18^{th} - 24^{th}$ October

The Theme for OWW 2021 is: "Act Now For Our Children's World"

One World Week occurs just before the COP26 United Nations Climate Summit, takes place in Glasgow in November 2021, (postponed from 2020). Britain is hosting this Conference which will be attended by national leaders and delegations from around the world. The aim is to build on the 2015 Paris Agreement with more ambitious commitments and measures to reduce carbon emissions and stop further climate change - so that all our children and future generations can enjoy a future in a sustainable world. The children themselves, inspired by Greta Thunberg, understand the urgency and have been pressing the adults to get on with it! **To do:-** Become a supermarket missionary. In the weekly shop try to make choices that reflect our Christian concern for the planet and for third world countries. Try to buy seasonal locally grown foods over foods that have travelled hundreds of air miles



Family Liturgy

This will begin on *Sunday 7th November* at the *10.30am Mass*

We will switch off the sound for the readings and use a microphone to read a children's version of the gospel.

After introducing any creative activities, the leader switches the sound back on so that parents can follow the Mass while their children do the activity.

Communion will be brought to the hall so that parents and older children can receive.




CONFIRMATION

St. Philip Howard

One of the Forty Martyrs of England and Wales. Philip was the earl of Arundel and Surrey and, although a Catholic, led a religiously apathetic life until his personal conversion, after which he was a zealous Catholic in the midst of Elizabethan England. Arrested by authorities, he was placed in the Tower of London in 1585 and condemned to death in 1589. The sentence was never carried out, and Philip languished in the Tower until his death at the age of thirty eight. Beatified in 1929, he was included among the English martyrs canonized in 1970 by Pope Paul VI. St. Philip Howard's body is enshrined at Arundel Cathedral, and he is co-patron of this diocese.

To Serve & Give His Life

What's the point of power and authority?
