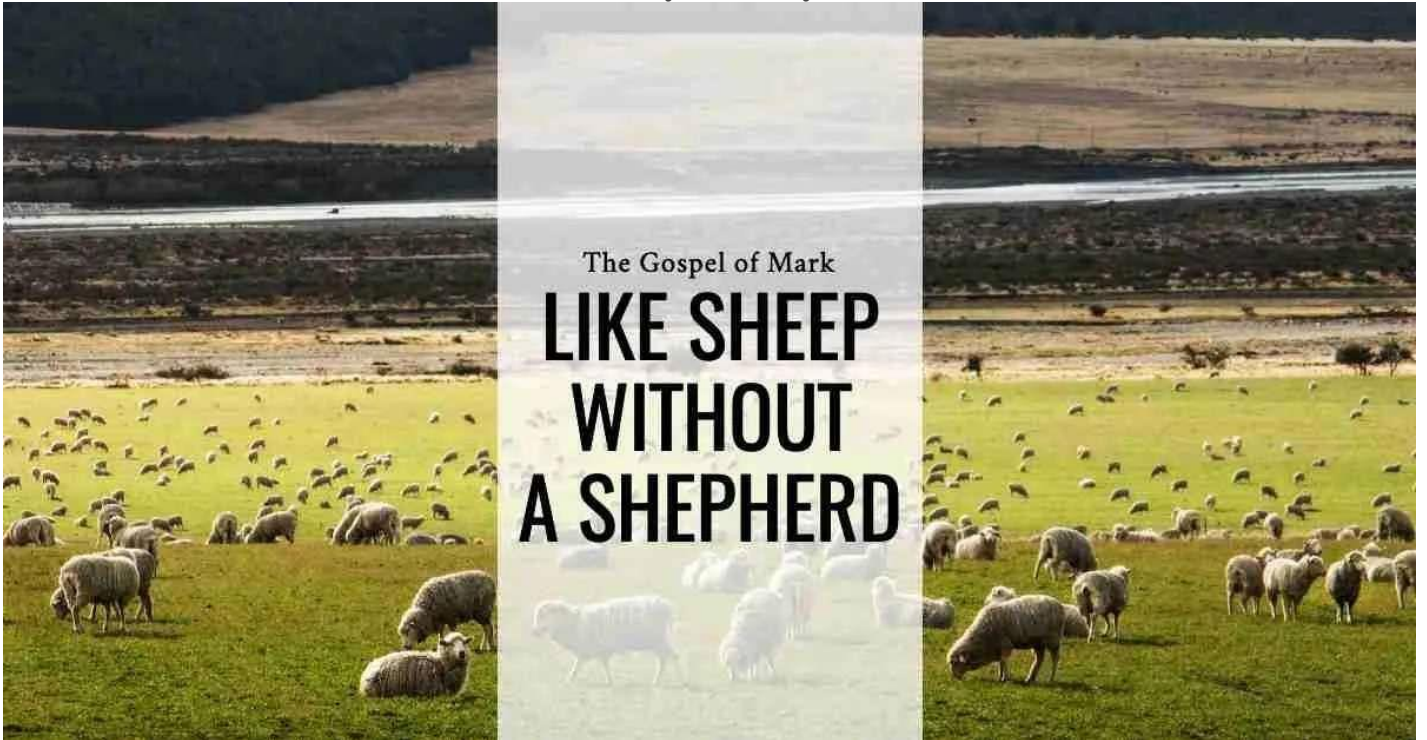

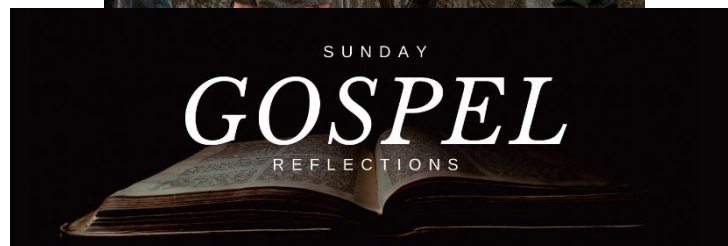

Sunday, July 21, 2024 | Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time | Mark 6:30-34

Friends, today's Gospel shows Jesus' compassion for the multitude in the desert. "When he disembarked and saw the vast crowd, his heart was moved with pity for them, for they were like sheep without a shepherd; and he began to teach them many things."

There is the motif of the people Israel in the desert after their escape from Egypt. Isolated, alone, afraid, without food, they clamored for something from Moses. Here we see people who are dying to be fed, and a prophet who is under threat of death. This crowd around the threatened Jesus is a metaphor for the Church.

We have come to him because we are hungry, and we stay even when things look bleak.

New Feast Day

The Vatican has granted permission for Our Lady of Walsingham to be celebrated as a new Feast in the dioceses of England, starting on 24 September this year. The Shrine of Our Lady of Walsingham was established in 1061 after devout noblewoman Richeldis de Faverches prayed for inspiration so that she could carry out a special work in honour of Our Lady. Our Lady appeared to Richeldis and showed her in spirit the House of the Annunciation where the Angel greeted Mary in Nazareth, asking her to build a replica in Walsingham as a perpetual memorial of the Annunciation. King Henry VIII's Reformation saw the famous statue of Our Lady of Walsingham taken to London and burnt in 1538. 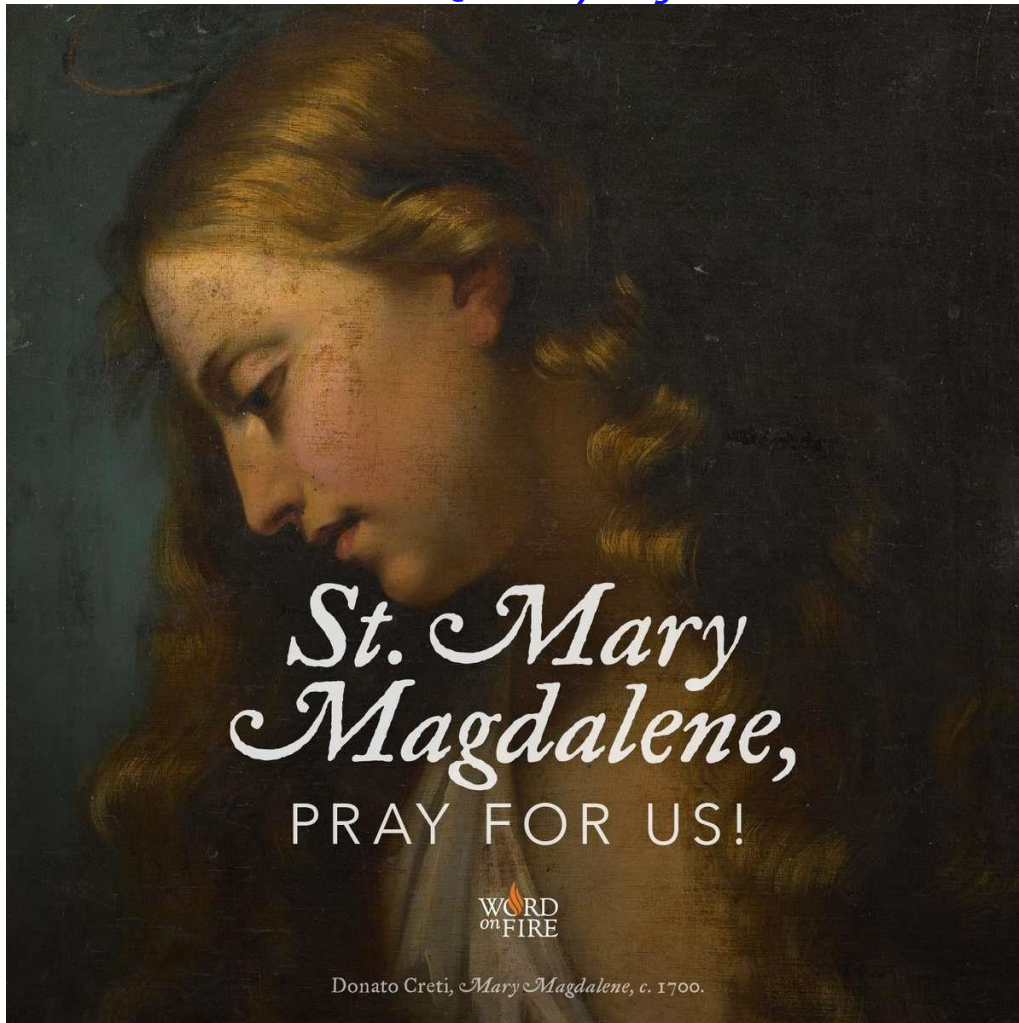

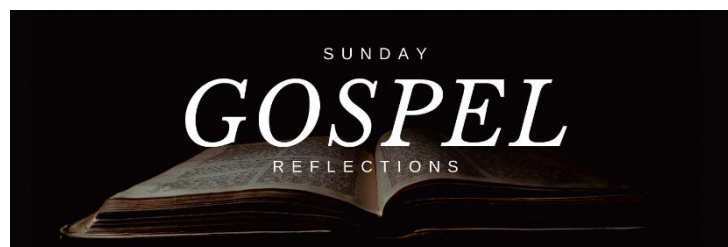
Feast Day July 25

- One of three apostles who witnessed Jesus' Transfiguration.
- First apostle to die. He was martyred when King Herod Agrippa decapitated him with a sword (Acts 12:1-2).
- The title "the Greater" was added to distinguish him from St James "the Less", who is believed to have been shorter.
- His remains can be found in the Cathedral of Santiago in Spain.
- Patron saint of pilgrims and Spain.

Feast of St. James

Thursday 25th July

O Glorious Apostle, Saint James, who by reason of your passionate and generous heart was chosen by Jesus to be a witness of His glory on Mount Tabor, and of His agony in Gethsemane. Obtain for us strength and consolation in the battles of this life, that, having constantly and generously followed Jesus, we may be victors in the strife and deserve to receive heavenly reward. Sunday, July 28, 2024 / Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time / John 6:1-15

Friends, our Gospel today focuses on St. John's intense meditation on the meaning of the Eucharist.

The tone is set with the familiar story of the feeding of the five thousand, the only miracle story mentioned in each of the four Gospels. This scene deeply affected the first Christians.

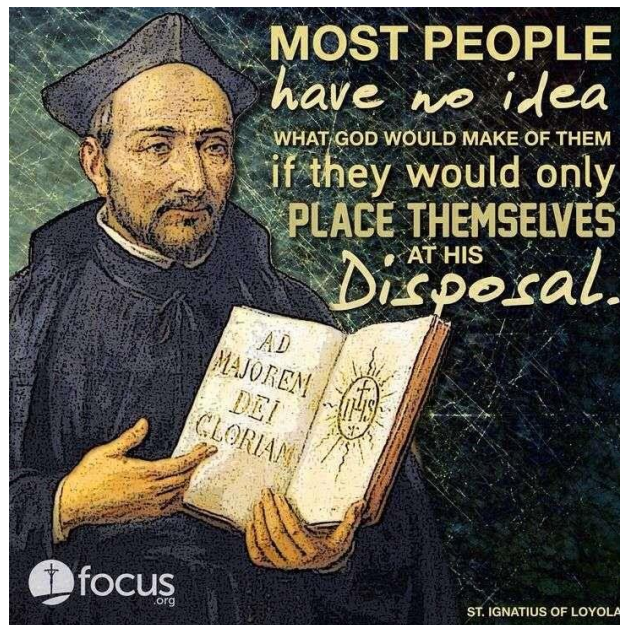

Jesus instructs the crowd to recline on the grass. Taking the barley loaves and dried fish, Jesus makes a meal that satisfies the enormous crowd. They are hungry, tired, and worn out from their exertions, and Jesus gives them sustenance for the day.

For Thomas Aquinas, the great metaphor for the Eucharist is sustenance, food for the journey. Baptism defines us, making us sons and daughters of God; Confirmation confirms and deepens this identity; Marriage and Holy Orders seal us in our life's vocation. These are sacraments offered once at key moments in one's life.

Then there is the Eucharist, which is daily food, nourishment to get us through the day-to-day. How effective would we be if we never ate, or ate only on special occasions and in a festive environment? Not very. So, in the spiritual life, we must eat and drink or we will not have the strength.



St. Ignatius of Loyola

Wednesday 31st July

Born in Northern Spain, Ignatius' leg was shattered by a cannonball in 1520. During his recovery, he read stories of the saints and the life of Christ and devoted himself to a life of holiness.

His followers became known as the "Society of Jesus," or "The Jesuits." Ignatius died in 1556 and was declared a saint in 1622.

He is the patron of soldiers and educators.
