

Sunday, May 4, 2025 | Third Sunday of Easter | John 21:1-19

Friends, we must attend to the mystical depth of today's Gospel. At the break of dawn, the disciples spy a mysterious figure on the distant shore who shouts out to them, "Children, have you caught anything to eat?" When they answer in the negative, he instructs them to cast the net over the right side of the ship. When they do, they bring in a huge catch of fish.

This fishing expedition is a symbol of the Church (the barque of Peter), across space and time, at its apostolic task of seeking souls. The life and work of the Church, John seems to be telling us, will be a lengthy, twilight struggle, a hard toil that will often seem to bear little or no fruit. But after the long night, the dawn of a new life and a new order will break, the transfigured world inaugurated by Jesus. The catch of fish that he makes possible is the totality of people that Christ will gather to himself; it is the new Israel, the eschatological Church.

We know this through a subtle bit of symbolism. When the fish are dragged ashore, John bothers to tell us their exact number, 153—a figure commonly taken in the ancient world to signify the total number of species of fish in the sea.

The Cardinals currently present in Rome have agreed to begin the conclave to elect the next Pope on Wednesday 7 May

They made the decision at the Fifth General Congregation held on Monday morning in the Vatican's Synod Hall. To validly elect a new Pope, a two-thirds majority of the electors present is required. The conclave will take place in the Vatican's **Sistine Chapel**.

When will the ballots take place?

A ballot is expected to take place on Wednesday evening, with the smoke produced by the burning of the ballot papers likely to appear before 20:00. If the ballot was inconclusive, a chimney above the Sistine Chapel emits black smoke. If a Pope is elected, white smoke will billow out of the chimney. On any subsequent days of voting, two rounds of voting will take place in the morning, with the smoke from the two sets of ballot papers (which are burnt together) expected by midday, and two in the afternoon, with the voting papers likely burnt before 20:00. If the electors fail to reach an agreement on a candidate after break three of up to one day allowed. What happens immediately after a new Pope is elected? Once the Cardinals have elected a new Pope, the Dean of the College, Cardinal Re, will ask the elected candidate whether he accepts his election, and by what name he wishes to be known. The Cardinal Proto-Deacon will then announce the name of the new Pontiff to the faithful with the famous line: "Annuntio vobis gaudium magnum; Habemus Papam." (I announce to you a great joy: we have a Pope) with the new Pope giving the Apostolic Blessing Urbi et Orbi (to City and the World) from the Loggia of St Peter's Click here to read more about the Conclave on our website. The Bill to Legalise Assisted Suicide The Terminally Ill Adults (End of life) Bill has now completed the Commons Committee Stage. This is the point at which a selected group of MPs scrutinise the Bill line by line and consider suggested amendments. Sadly, virtually all amendments to strengthen protections for the vulnerable were rejected and the proposed scrutiny of each application by a High Court Judge has been replaced by a panel which will not have the same powers to gather relevant evidence. The Bill as amended will return for scrutiny by the whole House of Commons (Report Stage) on Friday May 16. That will be followed by the Third Reading when MPs have, effectively, the final opportunity to accept or reject the Bill as amended. The Third Reading will probably be either on May 16 or June 13. If it passes at Third Reading it will almost certainly become law. So this is a critical moment. Please contact your MP and ask them to vote against the Bill at Third Reading.
